

## Village Council Election: May 14, 2001

Polls Open 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. at the Village Center

There are fourteen candidates for the seven seats on the Village Council. Five of the seven incumbent Council members are running. Mayor Alfred Muller and Vice Chairwoman Patricia Forkan are not running.

As in the past, the League of Women Voters of Montgomery County will conduct the election, which will take place on Monday, May 14. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. The polling place is the Friendship Heights Village Center, 4433 South Park Avenue.

Along with the League's representatives, the Council invited a group of residents to serve as judges on election day: Howard Denis, Chief Judge; Robert Schwartzbart; Marion Ladwig; Rosemary Collins; Kurt Liva; Kathy Corey; and Doug Ruff.

Prior to the election and up to and on the day of the election (before the polls close at 8 p.m.) any qualified voter may apply for an absentee ballot.

Absentee ballot applications are available at the Center and must be completed and returned to Bea Zastrow, the League representative, before a ballot will be delivered. Because the deadline for mailing the application (May 4) has passed, absentee voters must

call Ms. Zastrow directly at 301-654-7904 to make arrangements. For an absentee ballot on election day, call the League at the Center, 301-656-2797.

### Willoughby Park Nears Completion

As this goes to press, **Willoughby Park**—the name chosen by the Council at its April 9 public meeting—is beginning to take final shape. Most of the concrete infrastructure has been completed (only some stairways remain to be done), and pavers are being installed.

The sidewalk on Friendship Boulevard adjacent to the park will have brick pavers using the Bethesda standard (the same style also in front of Highland House on Wisconsin Avenue).

Thus ends a successful Village Council effort to provide a significant asset to the community while protecting The Willoughby from further development next door.
