Wednesday, April 4—Barrie Goodman—Jazz instrumentalist Barrie Goodman and cabaret singer Patsy Grady Abrams offer songs from the great American songwriters and jazz composers. The program includes tunes from “Tin Pan Alley,” as well as popular songs from World War II, Broadway show tunes, jazz, ragtime and the blues.

Wednesday, April 11— Touchton/Lum Duo—Pianists John Touchton and Virginia Lum offer a program featuring works by Bach, Schubert, Debussy, Dvorak, Moskowski, Faure, and Brahms. John Touchton holds performance degrees from Baylor University, the College-Conservatory of Music in Cincinnati, and the University of Michigan. He has performed at the White House, the National Cathedral, the Salzburg Music Festival, and the Mostly Mozart Festival. Virginia Lum is a graduate of Julliard and has been a guest soloist with the St. Louis, Baltimore, Honolulu, Westchester, Arlington, and Alexandria Symphonies.

Wednesday, April 18— Tales in the Village featuring Susanna Holstein—Known as “Granny Sue,” Susanna performs across West Virginia and out of state, telling stories and singing Appalachian and British ballads. She is a member of several regional storytelling organizations. She is the mother of five sons, grandmother of 14, and great-grandmother of one. When not writing or telling stories, she enjoys gardening, canning and life on her small farm in Jackson County.

Wednesday, April 25—Great Moments from the Stage, Opera and Broadway—Hear solos and duets from the great works of the operatic stage, such as: *Lakme*, *The Tales of Hoffman*, *Cosi Fan Tutte*, *The Marriage of Figaro* and *Don Giovanni*.
