Wednesday, Dec. 5—*Georgetown Visitation Madrigals*—The Madrigal Singers are an auditioned chamber choir from the all-girls Catholic school in Georgetown and serve as musical ambassadors of the school. Members of the Madrigals, who also perform with the Visitation Chorus, rehearse three to four hours each week and perform frequently, both on and off campus. Vocal skills are emphasized and all musical styles are performed. The Madrigals' holiday program will feature a number of secular songs including *Sleigh Ride* and *The Most Wonderful Time of the Year*, as well as religious songs such as *Ave Maria*, *Chanukah*, and *Come, Adore The Infant Holy*.
